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
Protesting as Informed Choice

- Civil disobedience or constitutionally-protected protest?
- After arrest:
 - Plead or fight the charges?
 - Constitutional claims
 - Alford pleas

When in public spaces where you are lawfully present you have the right to photograph anything that is in plain view.



constitutional issue spotting:

First Amendment violations

- Facial (ACLU)
- As applied (defense counsel)
- Due Process violations
 - Actual notice and opportunity (failure to disperse)
 - Individual proof/mens rea (rioting, property damage)
 - Vagueness

Fourth Amendment violations

- Seizure of video or cell phone evidence without warrant
- <u>Excessive Force</u>





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
